Bev Dahlby is an economist with an extensive experience in tax policy and fiscal federalism. He attended St. Peter's College and holds degrees from the University of Saskatchewan, Queen's University, and the London School of Economics.

Dr. Dahlby was Professor of Economics at the University of Alberta for over three decades (1978–2012) before joining the School of Public Policy at the University of Calgary as a Distinguished Fellow in Tax and Economic Growth (2012–2020). His professional contributions include serving as Associate Editor of Canadian Public Policy and as a member of the editorial board for the Canadian Tax Journal.

He has also been a member of the Executive Council of the Canadian Economics Association and the National Statistics Council.



In 2010, Dr. Dahlby was awarded the Doug Purvis Memorial Prize by the Canadian Economics Association for a work of excellence relating to Canadian economic policy.

Dr. Dahlby has served as a policy advisor to the federal and provincial governments and international agencies. His most significant appointments include: The Mintz Committee (Technical Committee on Business Taxation); The Jenkins Panel (Federal Support for Research and Development); The Blue-Ribbon Panel (Review of the Government of Alberta's Finances); and Chair of the British Columbia Commission on Tax Competitiveness. Internationally, his activities include tax reform in Malawi for the IMF, tax enforcement and excise tax reform for the Thailand Development Research Institute and reform of intergovernmental transfers in Mexico and Brazil for the World Bank. Recently, he served as an advisor on a major World Bank report on the evaluation of government subsidies.
