A former Canadian diplomat, Colin Robertson is a Canadian Global Affairs Institute Fellow, hosting their Global Exchange podcast. A contributing writer to Policy Magazine, he is a frequent media commentator.

An Honorary Captain (Royal Canadian Navy), he is a member of the Alphen Group of strategists, the Expert Group on Canada-U.S. Relations., an Executive Fellow at the University of Calgary's School of Public Policy and a Distinguished Senior Fellow at Carleton's Norman Paterson School of International Affairs.

A career foreign service officer (1977-2010), he served as first Head of the Advocacy Secretariat and Minister at the Canadian Embassy in Washington, Consul General in Los Angeles, Consul and Counsellor in



Hong Kong, and in New York at the UN and Consulate General. His HQ assignments included the UN, U.S., Federal-Provincial, Policy Planning, and Public Affairs, assistant to Foreign Minister Allan MacEachen, and later the Deputy Minister (Trade). Other executive assignments included the Treasury Board Secretariat, Citizenship & Immigration, Petro-Canada International Assistance Corporation and as president of the Historica Foundation.

A member of the team that negotiated the Canada-U.S. FTA and NAFTA, he co-authored Decision at Midnight: The Inside Story of the Canada-US FTA (1996). In his final foreign service assignment he directed a project on Canada-U.S. Engagement.

Robertson was editor of bout de papier: Canada's Journal of Foreign Service and Diplomacy and president of the Professional Association of Foreign Service Officers.

After retiring from Foreign Service, Robertson was a senior advisor to Dentons US LLP working with the Business Council of Canada.

Robertson has received the King Charles III Coronation Medal, Diamond Jubilee Medal, Canadian Forces Decoration, Alberta Centennial Medal, Saskatchewan Centennial Medal and Mexico's Order of the Aztec Eagle.
