Leonardo Beltran a seasoned energy professional with more than 20 years of experience. Mr. Beltran is the Advisory Group Chair of the Evaluation and Learning Initiative of the Climate Investment Funds; a member of the Board of Por México foundation; a member of the technical advisory group of World Bank's ESMAP; member of the World Economic Forum's Energy and Industry Transition Intelligence Advisory Board, and of the Accelerating Clean Hydrogen Initiative and of its Expert Network; member of the Strategy Committee of the Mexican Association for the Promotion of the Electric Vehicle (AMIVE); and mentor of the Latin America regional program of the Global Women's Network for the Energy Transition.

Mr. Beltran holds non-resident senior fellowships with the Energy Transition and Climate Program at the Inter-American Dialogue, the



Center on Global Energy Policy of the University of Columbia, the Institute of the Americas, the School of Public Policy at the University of Calgary, and on Energy and Sustainability at the Mexican Council of International Affairs (COMEXI). He is a member of the editorial committee of Enerlac from the Latin American Energy Organization (OLADE), a member of the Assembly of IPS News and a member of the Harvard Club of Mexico.

Mr. Beltran served in the government of Mexico as Deputy Secretary for Planning and Energy Transition (2012-2018), Member of the Board of Pemex (2013-2014) Director-General for Information and Energy Studies (2010-2012) and Director for International Negotiations (2005-2010). He also served in the Board of SEforALL (2017-2023) and was senior advisor to ICM (2024-2025), philanthropic organization focused on climate mitigation efforts. In the private sector, he was a consultant to BBVA Bancomer (2000-2003). Mr. Beltran also consulted with the Inter-American Development Bank, the Latin American Energy Organization, the Organization for Economic Cooperation and Development, the World Bank and the United Nations Industrial Development Organization.

He holds a Master in Public Administration in International Development from Harvard Kennedy School, a Bachelor of Science in Economics from Instituto Tecnológico Autónomo de México (ITAM) and studied Law at Universidad Nacional Autónoma de México (UNAM).
