Dr. Robert Skinner (Hon BSc, Geology, Queen's University; MSc and PhD Geology, University of Washington) is an Executive Fellow of The School of Public Policy. He has over four decades of experience in government, industry and academia.

He has authored numerous papers, reports and articles on energy and environment, energy policy and market regulation. His broad expertise covers national and international energy policy, geopolitics, research strategy and organizational structure, business development, project analysis and risk assessment.

He held senior energy policy positions in the Canadian government, including as Assistant Deputy Minister responsible for policy advice on energy commodities, alternative transport fuels and nuclear energy.



He was Director of the Policy Office of the International Energy Agency at the OECD in Paris in the nineties, where he led the Agency's analysis on energy and climate change, member countries' energy policy reviews, electricity, natural gas, coal, nuclear and energy end-use. He also led teams to provide structural and energy policy advice for economies in transition in eastern Europe and for post-apartheid South Africa. His industry experience was with TOTAL and Statoil, including establishing their offices and business development in the Alberta oil sands.

He is a Distinguished Fellow and former Director of the Oxford Institute for Energy Studies.
