- Co-leading a computer vision pilot on a blockchain container tracking platform engaging the Port, a trans-load operator, border and customs stakeholders and a global technology services provider.
- Leading Deloitte's Sustainable Aviation Fuel (SAF) Ecosystem Initiative – a cross industry collaboration involving two airports, an airline and clean tech organization to realize lower carbon fuel alternatives in aviation. Stakeholders engaged spanned the full value chain from feedstock providers through mid-stream oil and gas, Federal and Provincial Ministries, OEMs, civilian end users (parcel goods/air cargo and passenger) and defense.
