Greg Poelzer, PhD., is a Professor in the School of Environment and Sustainability at the University of Saskatchewan, Canada. Greg is Co-Lead of the Energy and Mineral Resources for a Sustainable Future Signature Area of the University of Saskatchewan. For over thirty-five years, Greg has engaged in research focused on comparative policy as it relates to Indigenous-relations; energy, mineral, and resource development; and capacity-building in the North. Greg's co-authored book, *Arctic Front: Defending Canada in the Far North* (2008), was awarded the Donner Prize for excellence and innovation in Canadian public policy writing. Greg was also a negotiator for more than a decade in the energy sector for SaskPower and, before that, was negotiator for the Federation of Sovereign Indigenous Nations.
