Widely recognized as a leading voice on defending and advancing Western Canadian trade interests, Dade is a frequent media commentator who has played a pivotal role in shaping trade strategies that safeguard economic stability and growth. His expertise is particularly crucial as the trade relationship between Canada and the United States faces significant challenges.

Along with his role at the School of Public Policy, Dade is a Professional Affiliate at the Johnson Shoyama School of Public Policy at the University of Saskatchewan, an honorary senior fellow at the School of International Development and Globalization at the University of Ottawa and a member of the Mexican Council on Foreign Relations. He served as a Non-Resident Senior Associate at the Center for Strategic and International Studies in Washington, D.C.
